


# In Loving Memory of Dr. Muhammad Khalid Riaz

The Human Development Foundation (HDF) mourns the loss of its esteemed Chairman and co-founder, Dr. Muhammad Khalid Riaz, who passed away peacefully in Chicago on 9th April 2025. Dr. Riaz was a celebrated interventional cardiologist, a Fellow of the American College of Cardiology and the American College of Chest Physicians, and a highly regarded member of the global Pakistani diaspora. He practiced medicine in the Chicagoland area for 50 years serving as President of Medical Staff and Member Board of Directors of Sherman Hospital in Elgin IL. His commitment to his patients earned him recognition among the Top Doctors in Chicago and Top Doctors in America by Castle Connelly and USA Today amongst many other accolades.

Driven by compassion and a steadfast commitment to benefit marginalized communities in Pakistan, Dr. Riaz became a founding chairperson of HDF in 1997 to promote human development and eradicate poverty through integrated programs in education, healthcare, economic

empowerment, and social mobilization. His leadership transformed HDF from a grassroots initiative into a respected force for sustainable development in Pakistan and beyond. In 2009 he was recognized in a publication of Georgetown University as one of the 500 Most Influential Muslims in the World for his work in poverty alleviation.

Dr. Riaz also served in prominent leadership roles across several organizations, including as President of the Association of Pakistani Physicians of North America (APPNA) and founding member of the Pakistan Political Action Committee (PakPAC).

Dr. Khalid Riaz leaves behind a legacy of service, compassion, and transformational impact. He will be deeply missed by his family, friends, colleagues, and the global communities he touched.

He is survived by his Wife, two Sons, Daughters in-law, grandchildren, siblings, and dozens of nieces and nephews that will forever cherish his memory.

May his soul rest in eternal peace.

### A Life of Service. A Legacy of Change.

On April 9, 2025, the Human Development Foundation (HDF) lost not just a founder, but its heart and soul. Dr. Khalid Riaz—visionary, mentor, healer, and humanitarian—passed away, leaving behind a towering legacy that continues to inspire and illuminate the path forward.

For decades, Dr. Riaz's life was a living

testament to the power of service. As a dedicated cardiologist in the United States and a passionate advocate for human development in Pakistan, he seamlessly bridged continents, hearts, and hopes. His work was never confined to borders or professions. He healed individuals with his hands and rebuilt communities with his heart.

### The Dream that Became a Movement

Dr. Khalid's greatest contribution was not a single act, but a movement. Alongside like-minded visionaries, he co-founded the Human Development Foundation—an organization rooted in the belief that sustainable change comes from empowering people.



# **Shaukat Khan,** former president of APPNA and HDF director, recalls the moment HDF was born:

"It was the year 1997. I had assumed the presidency of APPNA. Khalid Riaz and Nasim Ashraf approached me with an idea of starting a movement across Pakistan based on the Human Development Foundation concept. HDF was approved in the general body meeting of APPNA in New York City and hence started a movement to improve the well-being of the have-nots in Pakistan.

I had the occasion of working with Khalid very closely as a board of directors member of HDF. I found him a man of strong conviction and beliefs with sincere feelings for the people of Pakistan, and he spent all his life doing that. He was a man of principles and followed rules and regulations. We will miss him; however, his memories will be kept alive in the continuation of the work of HDF. My well wishes for his family."

Dr. Khalid's role in building HDF was deeply personal. He invested his time, energy, and soul into every detail, traveling frequently to Pakistan despite health challenges. He was committed to building schools, clinics, dams, and livelihood centers, touching the lives of thousands who were born into struggle but not without hope.

#### As **Dr. Wali Khan** put it:

"On April 9, 2025, Human Development Foundation became an orphan. The towering Founding Father of HDF, Dr. Khalid Riaz, passed. He lived a dignified, respectful, and purposeful life. He left a legacy of hope, conviction, and determination for the millions of poor Pakistanis who were born with no hopes. He touched and transformed the lives of so many. He left us with the burden of carrying on this arduous mission.

To describe brother Khalid in a few words is difficult. He was a man of discipline, rules, regulations, bylaws, record keeping, processes, and such. He was a visionary and an intellectual of uncommon wisdom. Those who knew him, know it all well. He was a hard

worker and demanded hard work from others. He never complained of being tired. He took HDF as a mission, not just a task to do. Traveling to Pakistan four times a year for years and years for the sake of HDF despite challenges of personal health is no easy feat. And that too along with the busy professional life of a cardiologist, a husband, and a father. What will happen to HDF after he is gone is difficult to predict. I remember his words describing HDF at a turning point. He took HDF to a certain height. Now it is for future generations to take it further. After talking to current leadership, I am hopeful for the future of HDF. There is a great desire and determination to carry the (orphan) mission to new heights. Insha'Allah, HDF will succeed."

I learned more from him in a few months than
I have from others in years. His guidance shaped my character, and his kindness touched my soul. Words will never be enough to capture his essence or to express my gratitude for the legacy he leaves behind.

Dr. Khalid will be deeply missed, but his spirit will live on in the countless lives he touched—and I count myself lucky to be one of them.
